# **ABOUT THE GLOBAL CITIZENSHIP CHALLENGE (GCC)**

The Global Citizenship Challenge is an intensive experience in team-building and problem-solving for motivated students aged 15-17 ready to take on real-world problems. Guided by program instructors, participants will study essential principles of teamwork and design thinking to create their own solutions to an unsolved problem affecting our global community. Students are supported throughout the course by real-time interaction with instructors and facilitators. At the end of the course, students will present their solutions to program staff, student leaders, and their fellow classmates.

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# **GCC COURSE LEARNING GOALS (SELECT 3)**

# LEARNING GOAL 1 | Presenting your ideas to others, both live and on video

- Use body language and vocal projection appropriate to the medium to optimize your message
- Help the audience follow your message using organizing strategies such as verbal signposting, rhythm and intonation
- Identify and define one or more key personal values or interpersonal competencies and describe an experience from your life that exemplifies each one

## **EARNING GOAL 2** | Identifying and questioning assumptions about other people and situations

- Identify common cognitive biases and how to counteract them
- Demonstrate increased self-awareness of your own biases, and of how to counteract them
- Demonstrate increased awareness of culture-specific norms and customs (in yourself and others), and of how to react and express yourself accordingly

# LEARNING GOAL 3 | Critically challenging words, definitions, and ideas

- Define a key word or idea in your own way and compare/contrast your own definition to that of others
- Critically examine and question words/definitions used by others; interpret a message on the speaker's own terms, not your own

# **LEARNING GOAL 4** | Researching and synthesizing information from more than one perspective

- Given an unfamiliar problem (i.e. the Global Challenge), gather information in order to determine the root cause(s) of the problem, and to identify its effects (positive or negative, social, economic or environmental) on two or more stakeholders
- Identify one or more trade-offs that your solution would have to address
- Create and describe a solution (or mitigation) to the problem that takes into account at least two of the stakeholders and/or effects mentioned above

# LEARNING GOAL 5 | Critically evaluating information sources for reliability and validity

• Compare similar information from more than one online source, and evaluate the credibility of each source and the validity of the information

#### LEARNING GOAL 6 | Identifying and critically analyzing multiple points of view and bias in media reporting

• Compare information sources that address the same topic from different points of view and suggest a possible bias for each source, as well as the interests that may underlie that bias
