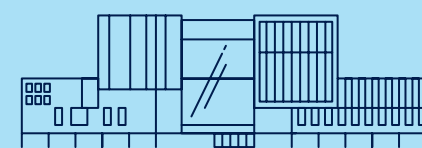
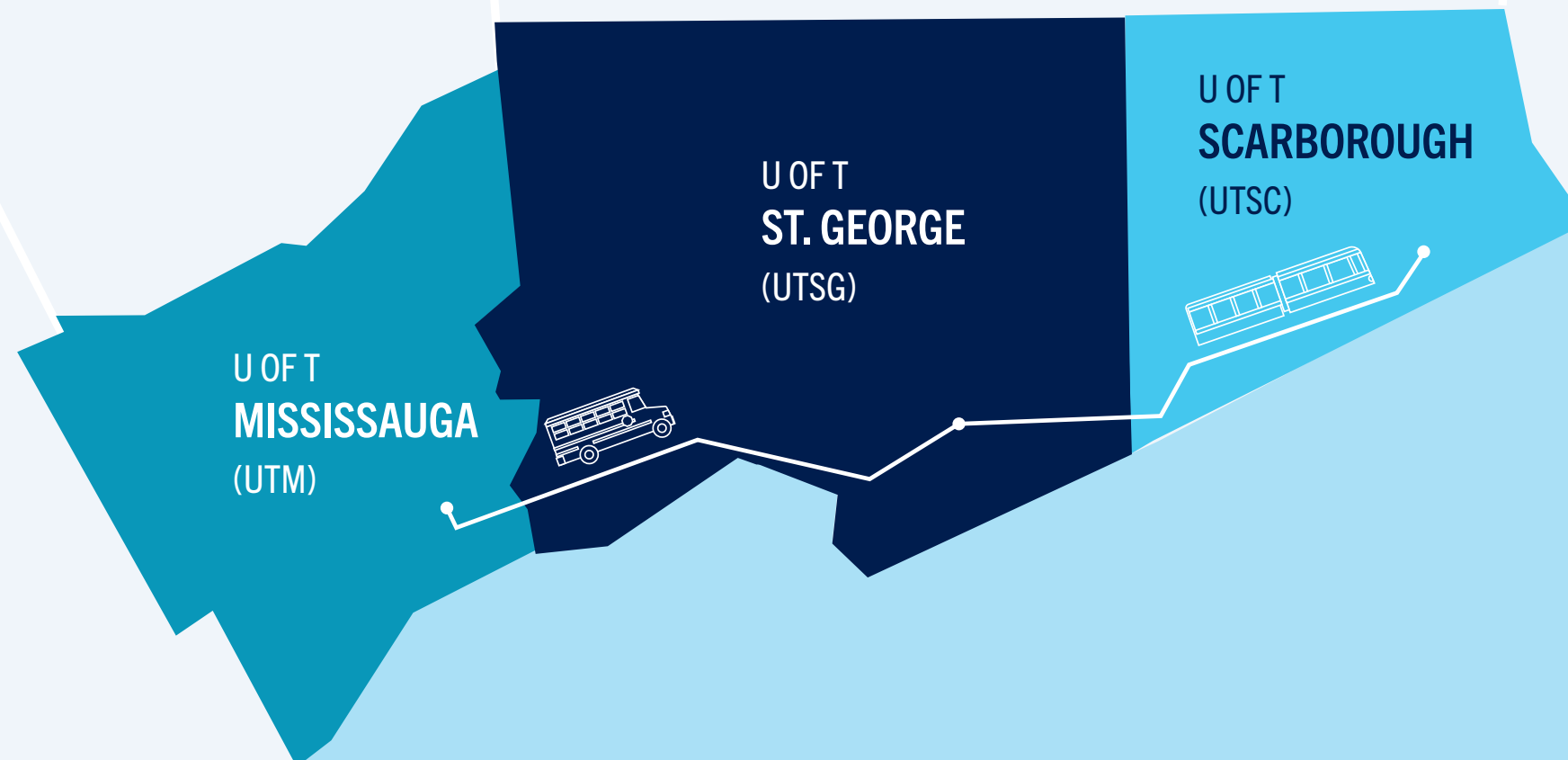

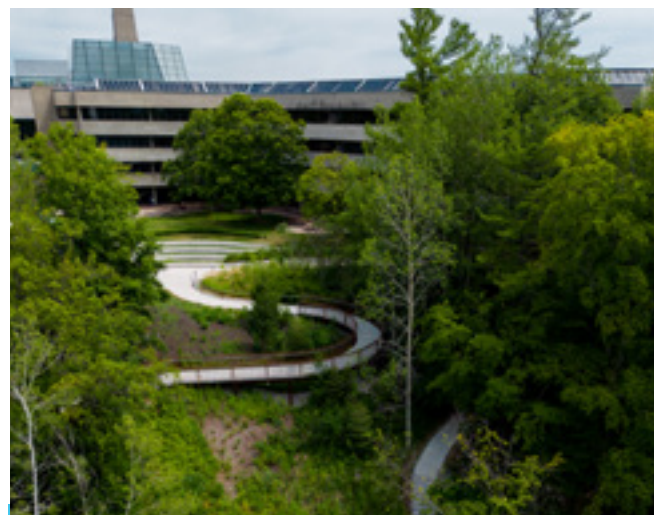

ADMISSION CONSIDERATION

Ontario Students: All programs require an Ontario Secondary School Diploma, and six Grade 12 U/M subjects, including ENG4U/AE4U.

Students from Outside of Ontario: All programs require completion of a Grade 12/ senior-level English course. Accepted qualifications for students educated outside of Ontario can be found at future.utoronto.ca/apply/requirements.

Many programs have additional prerequisites. The admission selection process includes consideration of the Grade 11/Junior and Grade 12/Senior academic record. Emphasis is placed on Grade 11/Junior results where marks in the required number of Grade 12/Senior courses are not yet available.

Admission is competitive and subject to space availability. The University of Toronto reserves the right to give preference to students with a consistent academic record whose marks are the result of a single attempt at each course. The "Approximate Grade Requirement" is based on the Ontario curriculum admission average from the previous year and is intended as a general guideline only. Grade requirements can vary from year to year.

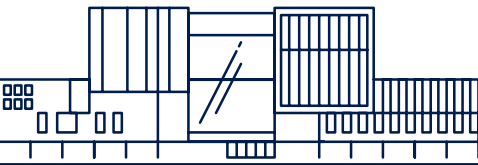

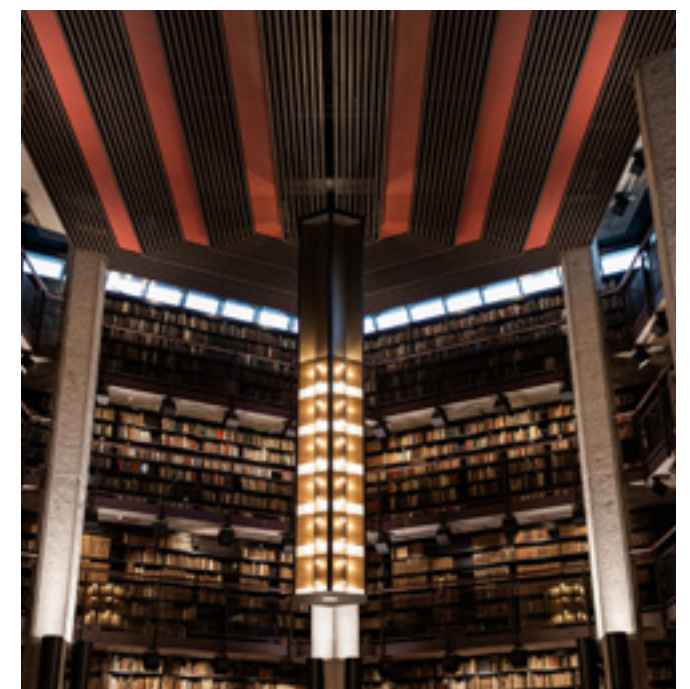

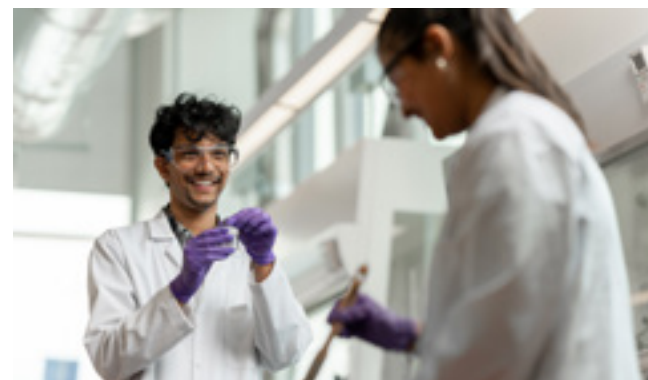

To apply for undergraduate studies, complete and submit your application through the Ontario Universities' Application Centre (OUAC). For detailed application instructions and deadlines, visit future.utoronto.ca/apply.

DEADLINES

We encourage you to submit your application by **November 7**, our recommended application date. The final deadline to apply is **January 15**. Applying by the recommended application date will give you enough time to complete all next steps by document deadlines. The deadlines for required documents, transcripts, and supplementary applications can vary by program, so keep a close eye on your email inbox and the application portals.

APPLICATION PORTALS

Shortly after we receive your undergraduate application from the Ontario Universities' Application Centre (OUAC), we will send you an acknowledgement email with details on how to access the Join U of T Applicant Portal: join.utoronto.ca; or the Engineering Applicant Portal: uoft.me/myportal.

Join U of T and the Engineering Applicant Portal are central hubs for you to track your application status, view and submit required documents, find next steps, receive admissions decisions, and access other important information. Check them regularly for updates regarding your application.

English is the language of instruction at U of T, and success in our degree programs requires a high level of English language proficiency. SCHOLARSHIPS & AWARDS

U of T offers many scholarships to support both domestic and international undergraduate students. While most awards are merit-based and are automatically considered, a few areas require an extra application:

► AWARDS PROFILE

Eligible domestic students are encouraged to complete the Awards Profile on Join U of T to be considered for various scholarships and awards. This profile helps match students with awards they may be eligible for based on their academic and personal achievements. future.utoronto.ca/awards-profile

► NATIONAL SCHOLARSHIPS

The National Scholarships recognize outstanding Canadian secondary school students who demonstrate superior academic performance and community involvement. The scholarship covers tuition, and residence fees for up to four years. future.utoronto.ca/national-scholarship

► LESTER B. PEARSON INTERNATIONAL SCHOLARSHIPS

The Pearson Scholarships recognize exceptional international students, including those currently at Canadian high schools. The scholarships cover tuition, books, and residence for up to four years. pearson.utoronto.ca

FINANCIAL PLANNING & SUPPORT

A variety of financial aid options are available to many students. For eligible domestic students, **University of Toronto Advanced Planning for Students (UTAPS)** helps fill the financial gap for educational costs not covered by their government student financial aid program. UTAPS provides non-repayable grants. Eligible students must complete a financial need application through the Need Navigator. Visit uoft.me/utaps for more information.

The **Ontario Student Assistance Program (OSAP)** and government student financial assistance programs from other provinces/territories offer a mix of grants and loans.

Canadian citizens and permanent residents who live outside Canada may also be eligible for provincial or federal financial assistance programs, as well as U of T financial aid supports.

For U.S. citizens or permanent residents, U of T is a Title IV eligible institution, participating in the William D. Ford Federal Direct Loan program. We are also an approved institution for the administration of subsidized and unsubsidized U.S. Direct Loans and PLUS Direct Loans.

NAVIGATING STUDY PERMITS

Understanding and obtaining the necessary documentation is crucial. **If you are not a Canadian citizen or permanent resident, you must obtain a valid study permit before entering Canada.** A study permit is required for studying at U of T and can be extended for post-graduation work permits. Learn more about study permits and post-graduation work permits through Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada at canada.ca/immigration-refugees-citizenship.

PROVINCIAL ATTESTATION LETTER

International students may need a Provincial Attestation Letter (PAL) for their study permit application. This letter

confirms your acceptance and eligibility to study in Ontario. The PAL is provided to students after they complete key steps, including accepting an offer of admission. Find out more at uoft.me/PALetter.

WORKING IN CANADA

Joining our community means gaining full access to all campus programming—including work study programs and co-op programs.
